



Billy Shellenbarger Named Superintendent Clawson Public Schools

CLAWSON, MI. - Billy Shellenbarger, Principal of Clawson High School and Middle School, has been chosen to be Clawson Public School's new superintendent.

"I plan to attack this job with every bit of enthusiasm I can. I love Clawson so much and I'm passionate about the community and the schools," Shellenbarger said.

He joined the district in 2018 as Principal of Clawson High School. In 2020 he added Clawson Middle School to his responsibilities as Principal. He served as the High School Boys Varsity Basketball Coach for four seasons from 2008-2012 and was voted MAC Conference Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012.

Shellenbarger began his career at Seaholm High School in Birmingham where he taught English and was an Intervention (RTI) Specialist. Subsequently he served as the Assistant Principal of Northville High School from 2014-2018.

He earned his Bachelor of Arts Degree in English Literature/ Physical Education and Post Baccalaureate Teacher Certification in English and Physical Education from Saginaw Valley State University. He received a Master of Arts Degree in K-12 Administration from Michigan State University.

"I am excited about Mr. Shellenbarger being the next leader of our district," said Board President Kimberly Carlesimo. "His pride in Clawson, his commitment to building a positive collaborative culture, and his integrity will serve us well. He is someone who listens and is committed to learning."

Shellenbarger will replace Tim Wilson who is retiring and moving to Florida August 12, after four years in Clawson.
