Entry Requirements for All Public and Non Public Schools

Age → Vaccine ** ↓	4 years through 6 years	7 years through 18 years Including all 7 th grade students
Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis	4 doses DTP or DTaP, One dose must be given on or after 4 years of age	4 doses D and T or 3 doses Td if # 1 given on or after 7 years of age 1 dose Tdap*** for children 11 through 18 years if 5 years since the last dose of Tetanus/Diphtheria containing vaccine
Polio	4 doses, if dose 3 is administered on or after 4 years of age only 3 doses are required	3 doses
Measles* Mumps* Rubella*	2 doses on or after 12 months of age	
Hepatitis B*	3 doses	
Meningococcal ****	None	1 dose for children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7 th grade or higher
Varicella* (Chickenpox)	2 doses of varicella vaccine at or after 12 months of age or current lab immunity or reliable history of disease	

*Current laboratory evidence of immunity is acceptable instead of immunization with antigen.

**All doses of vaccines must be given with appropriate spacing between doses and at appropriate ages to be considered valid.

***Tdap is required at 11 years of age or older regardless of grade.

****Meningococcal is not assessed in MCIR/Sirs if the child is 11 years of age and in a grade lower than 6th grade.




Please note the following:

- Parent/guardian must sign consent for children under 18 years
- Identification is required
- Legal Guardians must present current guardianship papers
- Bring all previous shot records
- Childhood Immunizations are provided from birth through age 18
- Seasonal Flu (Influenza) Clinics beginning in the fall each year

When To Stay Home

- Stomach ache
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea



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When To Stay Home

- Sneezing with discharge from the nose
- Red or runny eyes

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When to Stay Home

- Jaundice
- Rash
- Any skin eruption
- Skin eruption that is swollen and draining

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When to Stay Home

- Fever
- Sore throat
- Swelling or tenderness of glands especially at the neck
- Headache
